The public hearing for the FY 2023 Budget adoption was held on Wednesday, August 10, 2022, beginning at 5:30 pm at the Lower Platte South NRD Office in Lincoln. Legal notice of the hearing was published on August 4, 2022 in the Lincoln Journal Star newspaper, a copy of the affidavit of publication will be attached to the file copy of the record of the hearing.

Public in attendance included Bennie Shobe, Cory Schmidt, and Greg Osborn all of Lincoln. Directors present at the hearings included Bob Andersen, Susan Seacrest, Lisa Lewis, Deborah Eagan, Don Jacobson, Larry Ruth, Vern Barrett, Ray Stevens, Dave Landis, and Gary Aldridge. Staff present included Kristin Buntemeyer, Dave Potter, and myself.

Treasurer Andersen called the hearing to order at 5:30 pm. He explained that this hearing was for the purpose of receiving testimony on the proposed budget of expenditures for FY 2023. Andersen noted that there are copies of the budget available, the legal notice for this hearing was published on August 4th in the Lincoln Journal Star, and he turned it over to myself to review a budget summary. A copy of the budget summary presentation is attached.

Andersen asked if there were any public comments on the budget. Bennie Shobe provided comments regarding the importance and his interest in the District's work reducing flood risk, groundwater studies and management, working on the Haines Branch Prairie corridor, and the good job we do managing public tax dollars. 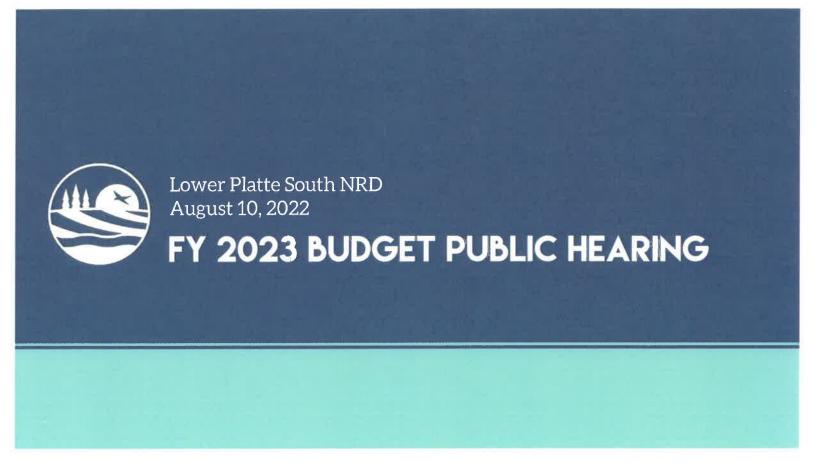

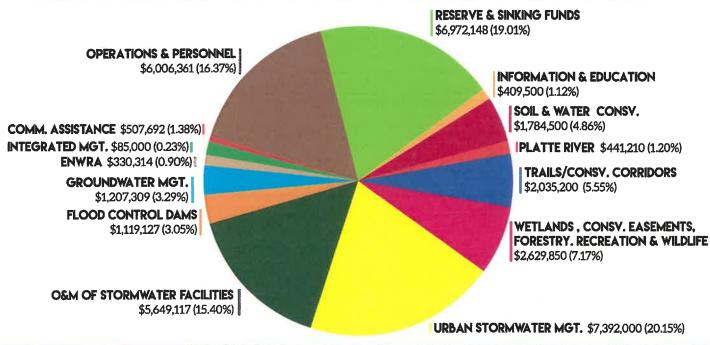

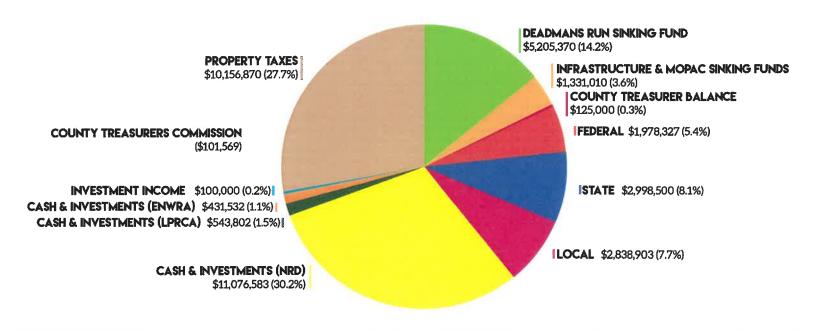

- 4. Ground water protection, studies, monitoring, testing, mapping & best management practices (\$1.2 million)
- 5. Stream Stability project on Lynn Creek & Salt Creek (\$1.1 million)
- 6. Prairie Corridor on Haines Branch Project (\$1 million)
- 7. Stream stabilization and bridge protection along several trail corridors (\$1.3 million)
