

In Review - The 2023 Nebraska Legislative Session

Four major themes dominated the 2023 Nebraska Legislative Session: The Filibuster, The Christmas Trees, The Money and Controversial Issues.

The Filibuster

Senator Machaela Cavanaugh spent hundreds of hours filibustering almost every bill debated on the floor of the Nebraska legislature in protest of a bill that restricts medical care to transgender minors. Because senators can speak three times for five minutes each on most amendments and motions, more than 2,000 amendments and 1,100 motions were filed to keep the filibuster going. A record number for certain. Eventually, that bill was modified to prohibit surgical procedures but allow other types of medical care after guidelines are established through a regulatory process. The bill was combined with another bill that, as amended, prohibits abortions after 12 weeks of gestational age.

The Christmas Trees

That same filibuster dramatically decreased the total number of bills that successfully made it across the finish line this session. In the end only 33 bills passed; however, they contained 291 individually introduced bills packaged together based on subject matter, colloquially referred to as "Christmas tree bills."

The Money

Nebraska entered this budget-setting legislative session with more than \$4 billion in surplus funds at its disposal. That four billion comes from historic levels of tax collections that have been taken in by the state. In the end, the approved budget set spending at \$5.34 billion in FY2023-24 and \$5.37 billion in FY2024-25, limiting spending growth in the state budget to 2.0% over the next two years. The budget also includes approximately \$1.16 billion in one-time transfers from the cash reserve fund to pay for various projects. Even after those transfers, the state will maintain \$828.8 million in its rainy-day fund in case of future budget shortfalls.

Big ticket items in the budget included hundreds of millions of dollars for the Perkins County Canal, the final funds and spending authorization for a new state prison, billions in property tax credits, foundation aid for students and additional special education funding, income tax cuts, a transition from previously allocated federal ARPA funds for north and south Omaha to instead use general fund dollars and then reallocating those federal funds toward water and infrastructure related projects.

Controversial Issues

An <u>almost filibuster-proof majority of registered Republican senators</u> aligned to pass bills on a variety of issues. The <u>combined bill that restricted transgender medical care and abortions</u> was a headliner in terms of conservative social issues this session. That bill is <u>already the subject of a lawsuit</u> to prevent it from becoming law.

Nebraska's first school choice related bill passed this session. The bill <u>provides tax credits for donations to entities that offer scholarships to private schools</u>. It was a major priority for Chair of the Revenue Committee, Senator Lou Ann Linehan, and Governor Jim Pillen. Within days of passage, the <u>teacher's union in Nebraska launched a ballot petition initiative</u> to invalidate it.

A <u>regulatory implementation process for voter ID</u> in Nebraska also passed this year, as did <u>repeal of Nebraska</u>'s motorcycle helmet law, and a <u>bill to allow permitless concealed carry of guns.</u>

> The bill increases the amount of grant funds available from \$60 million to \$90 million for a business park located in a qualified census tract within a city of the metropolitan class. The bill removes all references to ARPA and would direct \$10 million from the general fund for administration of the Economic Recovery Act. The bill directs that grants shall only be allowed to projects listed in the coordination plan or appendixes as of January 10, 2023 and provides some additional prioritization for grants that will assist small business development, job creation, and economic development within communities and neighborhoods.

The bill also adds additional grants for the following purposes: 1) no more than \$20 million to create a museum to honor Malcolm X within a qualified census tract within a city of the metropolitan class, and 2) no more than \$20 million to a federally qualified health center in a city of the metropolitan class.

The bill also redirects interest earnings off of the Perkins County Canal Project Fund and any interest generated off of funds designated for development of a new prison to be credited to the Economic Recovery Fund. The bill would expand the entities eligible to apply for shovel ready grants.

The bill has also been amended to include several other bills and provisions:

LB33 clarifies when a mayor in a city of the first class or in a city of the second class can vote on any matter.

LB 532 which changes provisions of the Community Development Law. These provisions include timely limits of how short an area may be designated as "extremely blighted," (no less than 25 years), extending the deadline for housing studies in cities other than those in the metropolitan class, (from 24 months to 60 months) and placing limits on the creation of new redevelopment plans in areas still designated as blighted (if it has had the designation for more than 30 years, the governing body of a city will not approve a new redevelopment plan unless the city conducts an analysis of the projects.)

LB 45 creates the Revitalize Rural Nebraska Grant Fund for cities of the first/second class/village, which would provide for a dilapidated commercial property demolition.

LB 342 removes the requirement that home inspectors should register with the Secretary of State every even-numbered year. The bill would also allow home inspectors to renew registration within 45 days of expiration, and have this registration be valid for 2 years.

LB346 which amends the Local Municipal Economic Development Act to expand what is considered to be a qualifying business in certain municipalities.

LB329 which would align state law with the federal American Innovation and Manufacturing (AIM) Act by permitting the use of refrigerants and equipment designated as acceptable in the federal legislation.

LB 629 changes provisions of the Middle Income Workforce Housing Investment Act. The bill establishes a sub-account within the Middle Income Workforce Housing Investment Fund which shall be used to fund affordable housing under the Economic Recovery Act.

LB 98 invovles "Micro-TIF," which concerns redevelopment plans receiving an expedited review under §18-2155. LB 98 would add an optional resolution before declaring an area to be substandard and blighted, allow limits on the number of expedited reviews of redevelopment plans, and permit redevelopment plans to be denied.

LB 170 matches the definition of "blighted area" under the Nebraska Investment Finance Authority Act with the definition under the Community Development Law (§18-2103.)

LB 223 concerns the Municipal Density and Missing Middle Housing Act. It requires each city that adopts an affordable housing action plan electronically submit their plan to the Urban Affairs Committee. The bill also allows an option in the report to either (1) show efforts to affordable housing action plans or (2) efforts to implement an affordable housing action plan after such a plan is adopted.

LB462 which would modify the definitions under Middle Income Workforce Housing Act to allow higher-cost housing construction projects to qualify under the act.

LB474 which would appropriate funds for facility updates at the Fort Robinson historical site, for the purchase, necessary updates, and management of the Mayhew Cabin, and for funds to be made available for the continued development of the Standing Bear Museum.

LB534 Slama Support Appropriations 03/13/2023 Committee Appropriate federal funds to the Department of Environment and Energy for community water 01/19/2023

The bill would appropriate \$150 million from federal ARPA funds to NDEE to provide grants to small and rural communities to construct drinking water infrastructure projects in community water systems and if appropriate public wells where water test levels are 10 ppm or higher of nitrate.

The bill incorporates several other bills into the package:

LB567 as incorporated would making changes to qualifications of high level managers employed by one public power district to be able to serve as a member of the board of directors of another public power and irrigation district, defines reliability to update the terms currently used in conversations about public power and adds a requirement that the annual load and capability report filed with the Nebraska Power Review Board on behalf of the utilities contain additional information if requested by the Board in writing,

Appropriates \$500,000 for grants to NPPD to be used for engineering and modeling work to prepare and support Nebraska in competing for one of the clean hydrogen hub designations.

LB568 as incorporated would create a work group to evaluate and make recommendations regarding the workforce training needs of the nuclear and hydrogen industries in Nebraska and provide an opportunity for collaboration of the industries and higher education in the state to provide grants, training, curriculum, programming, and marketing to meet the workforce needs of the industry as identified by the work group.

LB723 as incorporated would enables the Department of Natural Resources to employ alternative methods of contracting for public water and natural resources public surface water or groundwater-related infrastructure project. Regardless of the funding source. Would authorize the department to solicit and execute three additional methods of contracting — design-build, progressive design-build, or construction manager-general contracts for public surface water or groundwater-related infrastructure projects. The bill would authorize the department to hire an engineering or architectural consultant to assist with the development of project performance criteria and requests for proposals and any additional services as requested by the department in relation to a project and precludes consultants used from providing services in a proposal for a project upon which they have consulted. And directs the department to obtain requests for qualifications and compile and publish a pre-qualified contractor list, and authorizes the use of public-private partnerships, with the department responsible for oversight of any function that is delegated to or otherwise performed by a private partner.

LB425 increases the allowable hunting permit fee maximums. The bill adds that nonresident permit limitations can be imposed during a special predation seasons or extensions of an existing hunting season. The bill also states that an auction permit is not subject to the lifetime limit of 1 mountain sheep permit.

LB400 as amended and incorporated would replace eliminate the Pheasant Bounty Program and instead authorize landowners, their tenants, or agent, to destroy or have destroyed any predator preying on livestock or poultry or suspected of causing other damage on their land.

LB395 increases the amount of allowable compensation to Oil and Gas Commissioners and to set future increases.

LB217 extends the grants available under the Waste Reduction and Recycling Incentive Fund through 2029.
