Subject: Water Resources Subcommittee Meeting Minutes October 2023

The Water Resource Subcommittee met on Thursday October 12, 2023, at NRD office, at 6:00 pm. Subcommittee members present included Larry Ruth, Melissa Baker, Luke Peterson, Gary Hellerich, Susan Seacrest, Don Jacobson, and Mark Spangler. Staff present were Dave Potter, Mark Lindeman, Drew Ratkovec, and Mike Murren. to review, discuss, take action on two items, and one report given. A quorum was present for the meeting.

Consideration of the Annual Stream Gage Operation Agreement with the United States Geologic Survey Division. (Action)

There are 24 United States Geological Survey (USGS) gages located within the LPSNRD boundaries (see attached map). The NRD contributes funding to USGS towards the cost of operating 16 of these gages. These gages are used by the NRD to monitor water levels and precipitation and are an important tool for the Districts Flood Alert procedures. USGS requires its local partners to annually approve joint funding agreements with USGS for this assistance with the previous agreement approved by the Board on October 19, 2022. In total, it requires \$245,070 to operate, maintain, and monitor the gages, with the LPSNRD contributing \$122,765. Please find attached a copy of the annual joint funding agreement with USGS for the operation of these 16 gages at a cost of \$122,765 to the LPSNRD. There was some discussion on potentially updating gages all gages that do not have weather reporting capabilities, as only a few provide precipitation data. Staff agreed to investigate what would be required and costs and report to the subcommittee.

It was moved by Jacobson, seconded by Hellerich, to recommend that the Board of Directors approve the 2023 Annual Joint Funding Agreement with the USGS for operation of 16 stream gages in the Lower Platte South NRD in the amount of \$122,765. Roll call vote taken with Seacrest, Hellerich, Baker, Jacobson, Spangler. Peterson, and Ruth voting aye. Motion passed.

Request to Revise the Upper Salt 11-4 Easement (Action)

Upper Salt 11-4 is a watershed dam that was built in 1956. This dam is just South of 68th and Olive Creek Road. The current landowner is Princeton Road LLC. Ratkovec explained to the committee that the current landowner has plans to develop the area and requested that the NRD release a part of the easement from the 1950's that encumbered the whole parcel. The new easement will follow a contour line that is one foot above the top of dam elevation. The revised easement will contain current language the NRD uses on other projects that identifies restrictions within the easement and protects the watershed structure from future encroachments and ability to perform. It was explained that the current blanket easement over the entire property does not include these restrictions.

It was moved by Jacobson, seconded by Ruth, to authorize staff to prepare a revised easement for Upper Salt 11-4 and authorize the General Manager to execute said easement on behalf of the Board of Directors. Roll call vote taken with Seacrest, Hellerich, Baker, Jacobson, Spangler. Peterson, and Ruth voting aye. Motion passed.

Piening Dam Update

Murren reported on the status of the Piening dam 404 process. The wetland determination has been completed by HDR. The permanent wetland mitigation that is required is 2.6093 acres. The stream channel mitigation required is 519.1 feet. The plan is to use the LPSNRD's Blue Heron Marsh Wetland Mitigation Bank to mitigate the permanent wetlands. The stream channel mitigation will require the use of the Bundy Mitigation Bank in Sarpy County. This is an approved USACE bank for stream credits. The cost of purchasing the stream channel credits will be around \$51,000. The 404 permit will be submitted in the upcoming week. It was noted that onsite mitigation for this project would prove more expensive and timelier. The approval process can take up to six months, but by using the USACE approved wetland banks, this will likely expedite the process.

THIS AGREEMENT is entered into as of October 1, 2023, by the U.S. GEOLOGICAL SURVEY, Nebraska Water Science Center, UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR, party of the first part, and the LOWER PLATTE SOUTH NATURAL RESOURCES DISTRICTPARTY of the second part.

- 1. The parties hereto agree that subject to the availability of appropriations and in accordance with their respective authorities there shall be maintained in cooperation **the operation and computation of records for 16 streamgages**, herein called the program. The USGS legal authority is 43 USC 36C; 43 USC 50, and 43 USC 50b.
- 2. The following amounts shall be contributed to cover all of the cost of the necessary field and analytical work directly related to this program. 2(b) include In-Kind-Services in the amount of \$0.00

(a) \$46,920 by the party of the first part during the period October 1, 2023 to September 30, 2024

(b) \$122,765 by the party of the second part during the period October 1, 2023 to September 30, 2024

(c) Contributions are provided by the party of the first part through other USGS regional or national programs, in the amount of: \$27,370

Description of the USGS regional/national program: Federal Priority Streamgages Program

- (d) Additional or reduced amounts by each party during the above period or succeeding periods as may be determined by mutual agreement and set forth in an exchange of letters between the parties.
- (e) The performance period may be changed by mutual agreement and set forth in an exchange of letters between the parties.
- 3. The costs of this program may be paid by either party in conformity with the laws and regulations respectively governing each party.
- 4. The field and analytical work pertaining to this program shall be under the direction of or subject to periodic review by an authorized representative of the party of the first part.
- 5. The areas to be included in the program shall be determined by mutual agreement between the parties hereto or their authorized representatives. The methods employed in the field and office shall be those adopted by the party of the first part to insure the required standards of accuracy subject to modification by mutual agreement.
- 6. During the course of this program, all field and analytical work of either party pertaining to this program shall be open to the inspection of the other party, and if the work is not being carried on in a mutually satisfactory manner, either party may terminate this agreement upon 60 days written notice to the other party.
- 7. The original records resulting from this program will be deposited in the office of origin of those records. Upon request, copies of the original records will be provided to the office of the other party.
- 8. The maps, records or reports resulting from this program shall be made available to the public as promptly as possible. The maps, records or reports normally will be published by the party of the first part. However, the party of the second part reserves the right to publish the results of this program, and if already published by the party of the first part shall, upon request, be furnished by the party of the first part, at cost, impressions suitable for purposes of reproduction similar to that for which the original copy was prepared. The maps, records or reports published by either party shall contain a statement of the cooperative relations between the parties. The Parties acknowledge that scientific information and data developed as a result of the Scope of Work (SOW) are subject to applicable USGS review, approval, and release requirements, which are available on the USGS Fundamental Science Practices website https://www.usgs.gov/about/organization/science-support/science-quality-and-integrity/fundamental-science-practices



Request to Revise the Upper Salt 11-4 Easement

Civil Design Group, Inc. is working with Princeton Road LLC on developing an area by South 68th Street & Princeton Road. They have reached out to the NRD because we have an easement over this property for the Upper Salt 11-4 dam structure. This is a blanket easement from 1956 that was granted to us from the Lancaster Soil Conservation District. This means the original easement covered a quarter section, much more than what was actually needed, but this was the standard way to grant easements at that time due to it being easier to include the entire farm than a specific impacted area.

Civil Design Group, Inc. is requesting a partial release for a portion of the south half of this easement where they are developing homes. In doing so we would make our easement boundary more defined by making it in relation to the top of dam elevation with a 1' buffer. This will also allow the NRD to have more specific language in the easement and outline our flood control structure restrictions to ensure it is maintained and operated properly.



Upper Salt 11-4 - NRD Easements located in NW Sec 15, T7N-R7E, Lancaster Co.




